
All donations are welcome, big or small.



- D. Is Nutrition Counseling Covered (CPT codes 96150-96153) by a Registered Dietitian?
- E. (If yes, for what diagnosis?)
- F. Is Preventative Medicine Counseling Covered (CPT codes 99401-99404) by a Registered Dietitian?
- G. (If yes, for what diagnosis?)
- H. Does the Dietitian need to work in a facility under a physician?
- I. Is a physician referral needed?
- J. Is there both in-network and out-of-network benefits?
- K. In Network: # of visits/year limited? Does Deductible or co-pay apply?
- L. Out of Network: # of visits/year limited? Does Deductible or co-pay apply?
- M. Is the plan grandfathered?
- N. Reference number for your call:
- 3. **ADVOCATE BETTER COVERAGE:** If your insurance does not cover MNT, mail or fax a letter of appeal (ask Georgia at 307-752-8213 for sample letter).
- 4. **SUBMIT RESULTS** Submit the information you found ALONG WITH THE NAME OF YOUR INSURANCE PLAN to Georgia at www.tailorednutritionllc.com to upload into a database for all Wyoming RD's. The House of Delegates (HOD)

The House of Delegates (HOD) conducted a mega issue dialogue on business and management skills and a current practice issue discussion regarding the preceptor shortage and limited supervised practice positions on October 17-18, 2014. Over 210 delegates and interested Academy members convened in Atlanta, Georgia to discuss these topics. All materials pertaining to the Fall 2014 HOD Meeting can be found on the Academy Website at www.eatright.org/hod >Fall 2014 HOD Meeting> Meeting Materials. What Outcomes Resulted from the Fall HOD Meeting?

Two motions were developed and approved by the HOD following the two dialogues.

HOD Motion #1- Business and Management Skills: The HOD requests that the House of Delegates Leadership Team establish a task force with representation from DPGs and internal and external stakeholders. The task force will review all of the HOD input from the dialogue session to determine a plan to assist members and students with building, enhancing and utilizing skills and knowledge related to business and management.

HOD Motion #2- Preceptors and Supervised Practice Experience Positions: The HOD requests that the Speaker communicate all of the input generated by the HOD to ACEND, CDR and NDEP for their consideration in addressing these two critical issues facing the profession.

- 1. The first proposed amendment broadens the qualifications for the retired member from "no longer employed" to "no longer gainfully employed".
- 2. The second proposed amendment allows international students to become members under the international membership category.

As SDA Secretary, Courtney Nordhus says:


"The greatest benefit for me was seeing the plethora of opportunities and pathways available to me once I become an RD."
